Charles “Chuck” Klamer, 78, of Napoleon, Ohio died Saturday, November 6th, 2021 at Toledo Hospital. He was born May 15th, 1943 in Bessemer, Pennsylvania to the late Stephen and Virginia (West) Klamer. On February 12, 1998 he married Linda Guth in Kent, Ohio.

Chuck was a 1961 graduate of Mohawk High School, New Castle, Pennsylvania and received his undergraduate from Clarion University in Pennsylvania. He attended Temple University and The Ohio State University and attained his Master’s Degree in School Administration.

Chuck was hardworking, dedicated, and had the ability to inspire and nurture young minds over his 43 years of education. He began his career as a special education teacher at Perkasio High School, Perkasio, Pennsylvania, then became an education consultant at Ashtabula County Educational Service Center and finally a Superintendent at Bloomfield-Mespo Local School District, Trumbull County and James A. Garfield Local School District, Portage County.

He attended St. Augustine Catholic Church, Napoleon and was a member of the Napoleon Lion’s Club. He was a former Village Council member and member of the Chamber of Commerce in Garrettsville, Ohio. He was an Athletic Booster for Liberty Center Schools and James A. Garfield Schools. Most of all, he loved spending his later years watching his grandchildren grow and attending all their events.

He will be deeply missed by his wife, Linda; daughters, Lauren (Allan) Perunko of Champion, Ohio and Amanda (Casey) Mohler of Liberty Center; grandchildren, Steve Perunko, and Kate, Elle, Thomas, and Brooklyn Mohler; and a brother, Allan (Delores) Klamer of New Castle, Pennsylvania.

“ The news of Chuck's death was a shock in so many ways, and I waited to reflect before offering these words. He was a friend and colleague for more than 40 years, and I loved the man. He was my superintendent as a teacher and then a principal, he offered me a principal's position when he changed schools twice, we worked together in a variety of roles after that, and I considered him a dear friend. At Bloomfield-Mespo, Chuck and I led the district's reaction to the revocation of the district's charter by the state board of education ... and the return of that charter ... the first time it had ever happened, after the changes we, the board, and the community passed an outrageous amount of property tax millage, hired staff and implemented changes. We washed Amish buggies together to raise funds to keep the doors open while the charter revocation was appealed. We burned the revocation document together when it was returned. This was a fine, good and decent man, an exemplary human being, loyal, caring, thoughtful, detail and goal oriented, and relentless in the best of ways. I worked for him as a teacher and then a principal, and then with him in his role as Superintendent and mine as an executive with the Educational Service Center who served him. I loved the man. He was genuine, honest, hard-working, smart, perceptive, detailed, and way more compassionate than he let on.
