James E. Adams, 79, of Grelton, Ohio, died Saturday, November 13, 2010 in Napoleon, Ohio. He was born June 13, 1931 in McClure, Ohio to the late Arthur and Mabel (Pittman) Adams. On May 10, 1953, he married Arlene Riggs in Napoleon, Ohio and she survives. Jim was a lifelong farmer retiring in 2000 when his son Doug took over the operation. He also served 12 years on the Tri-County Rural Electric Board, 8 of those years as president. Jim was also a member of Sharon United Methodist Church where he served as president of the board, pastor parish relations committee, numerous other committees, and always enjoyed singing in the choir. He also adored his 2 great grandsons and was looking forward to the arrival of 2 more great-grandchildren soon. He was preceded in death by his brothers Ronald and Gerald, who died in infancy.
