Mary Virginia Collier December 18, 1922-November 13, 2009 Mary Virginia Collier passed away on November 13, 2009 at age 86. She was born in Leipsic, Ohio on December 18, 1922 to George and Pearl Tawney, and was youngest of five siblings. Virginia married her loving husband John P. Collier, June 20, 1948, he survives. She is also survived by sons John S.
