Edna Marie Fintel, 100, of Deshler, Ohio died Saturday afternoon, December 5, 2015 at Bridge Hospice Care Center, Bowling Green, Ohio.

She was born July 14, 1915 in Liberty Township, Henry County, Ohio to the late Carl and Emma (Bergman) Schroeder. On April 12, 1936 she married Arthur Fintel at St. Stephen Lutheran Church, Hamler and he preceded her in death on February 22, 2003.

Edna was a homemaker and farmwife.
