John D. Mohler, 66, of Napoleon, Ohio died unexpectedly Saturday, March 31, 2018 at the Henry County Hospital. He was born February 14, 1952 in Napoleon, Ohio to the late Daris and Marcella (Reiser) Mohler. On August 4, 1979 he married Magdalene “Maggi” (Sauer) Mohler and she survives.
