Lucille Anna Ida (Lapp) Knepley, 88, formerly of Napoleon, died peacefully on Saturday, November 12, 2011 at Delmar Gardens of Smyrna, GA. She was born on April 20, 1923 in Chicago, IL to the late Harry and Florence (Pomplun) Lapp. On December 26, 1944 she married Gerald W. Knepley who preceded her in death in 2009. In 2010 she relocated to Georgia to be closer to her daughter. Lucille graduated from Hirsch High School in 1941 and became an executive secretary for Goodman Manufacturing in Chicago. After marrying and moving to Ohio, Lucille was a homemaker and also worked for the City of Napoleon billing department until retiring in 1985. She relished her role as grandmother to ten and great-grandmother to five. Lucille is also survived by sisters-in-law, Jean (Ralph) Knepley of West Palm Beach, FL and Elizabeth (Charles) Lapp of Orland Park, IL. She was preceded in
