“ I am really very sad to hear of Larry’s passing. He was a good friend to me way back when. I am one of his old Ridgeville buddies who grew up and went to school with him since kindergarten in the same class. I moved off a couple years after high school and have not seen Larry since the early 70’s. We were close friends in those days. We were all a bunch of buddies who hung out and ran around together as teenagers and continued after High School until we all went our separate ways. There were about 6 or 8 of us close friends who did and went everywhere together. It was all in good fun, some stories I can’t mention here, but some I will in honor of my old buddy. I share this because they are good memories of Larry that I have carried with me for 40+ years. We all got our first motorcycles the same year and together rode them all over; this would be back around 1972. Larry’s first motorcycle was a Honda 450 4 cylinder, copper bronze in color, a beautiful bike. He had the only 4 cylinder, we all had only two. I was on my motorcycle cruising the road with him along with the rest of the gang, about six of us, when Larry was hit by a car and totaled out that fine bike. I saw him fly over the hood of the car 20’ into the air. When the dust settled we could not find Larry anywhere. He was not in the road but landed some distance away in ditch. I saw him lying in the creek moaning with his legs all twisted and his blue jeans torn in pieces, we just knew both legs were broken in several places. We all thought Larry was a goner then. They took Larry by ambulance to the hospital while we had to stay to fill out police reports. Later, to the surprise of all he survived with only minor bruises and not one broken bone. This happened on a Sunday afternoon cruise north in Michigan. Larry was out front leading our pack of motorcycles. A car met us and passed by. Larry was single back then and unattached, and he spotted a couple of pretty girls in the car. So out of the blue he just slammed on the brakes and made a u-turn in the middle of the road to go check out the chicks. None of the rest of us knew what was going on; it was just Larry who decided to go chase these hot babes. We all saw Larry braking and we hit the brakes, but the car behind us was not able to, and broadsided Larry as he made the u-turn in front of the

car. Thatâ€™s when Larry went airborne. It was quite a scare for all of us. Larry was not only a lot of funâ€¦ but a real survivor with a guardian angel. I could tell you more interesting details about this particular story, but another time. Another day we all also faced a narrow escape with Larry. Larryâ€™s first car was a Cougar late 60â€™s â€¦ 67 or 68 model. All us buddies usually all met up for the weekend and went out somewhere or just went driving around cruising the streets. Different ones of us drove each night, and Larry happened to be driving his Cougar this particular night. Not much was happening and Larry for some reason fell into this macho high speed race car driver mood and began driving down this unknown country road about 90 miles an hour. We knew not why, just a guy thing maybe. I think we were somewhere between Bryan and Stryker where itâ€™s rather hilly. For the first time we all felt a bit scared riding with Larry, although none would admit it. It was pitch dark, the road became curvy and momentarily hillyâ€¦ and then all of a sudden the car went air-bornâ€¦ literally! We could all feel the car leave the ground and come back to the road with a hard thud. We felt the floor board hitting the road on our feet and then the car was screeching, bouncing and weaving back and forth. Larry did an excellent job of keeping the car under control however, but within a few minutes the engine started knocking, warning lights came on, and then the motor died. Come to find out the impact of being airborne and landing back on the road had scraped a hole in the bottom of the oil pan. All the oil had quickly leaked out and the engine gave up. I canâ€™t remember how we got home or what became of Larryâ€¦
