Lynn Herbert Lamming, 94, of Defiance, Ohio passed away at his home, surrounded by his family on Sunday, July 23, 2023. He was born in Manchester, Michigan on December 27, 1928 to the late Herbert and Lola (Lloyd) Lamming. On June 26, 1955, he married Mary McClelland in Reading, Michigan.

Lynn served his country in the US Army, 11th Airborne Division, during the Korean War. He worked as a metallurgist for GM for over 37 years.
