Richard Earl McCance, 87, of Deshler, Ohio died Wednesday morning, April 16, 2008 at the Bridge Hospice Care Center, Findlay, Ohio. He was born March 14, 1921 in Napoleon, Ohio to the late Clenzo and Ruth (Rehl) McCance. On May 28, 1945 he married Virginia Doda and she preceded him in death in October 1965.
