Michael Ray Hurst, 69, of Napoleon, Ohio died Friday, April 22, 2022 at St. Vincent Mercy Hospital, Toledo. He was born August 18, 1952 in Napoleon to Raymond and Dorothy (Shibler) Hurst. On February 16, 1973 he married Susan Hogrefe at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Okolona.

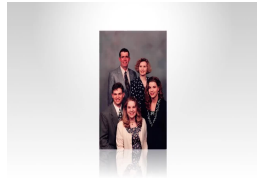
