Fred E. Parker, 79, of Napoleon, Ohio died Monday, Jan. 28, 2008 at Country View Haven of Napoleon. He was born Dec. 19, 1928 in Napoleon, Ohio to the late Frederick E. & Josephine (Hall) Parker. In 1952 he married Deni (Hefty) Parker in Phoenix, AZ, who survives. Fred worked as an accountant in the payroll division for Wren Reese, Inc. in Napoleon for 24 yrs, a former assistant manager for G.C. Murphy's in the early 1950's, and also worked part-time for Safety, Grooving, & Grinding in Napoleon for 4 years. He served in the U.S. Army during WWII. He was a member of the St. John Episcopal Church of Napoleon, where he was former head of maintenance. He was a member of several local bowling leagues, the Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity, and the Bert G. Taylor American Legion Post #300 of Napoleon. He is also survived by a daughter, Jane (Joe) Meyer, sons, Tom (Jenny), Rick (Sherry), Rex (Deb), and Duff (Connie) Parker, all of Napoleon, sister, Lettie Hale of Defiance, 12 grandchildren, and 6 great grandchildren. He was also preceded in death by 2 brothers, William & James Parker, and a sister, Patricia Speiser. A memorial service will be held at 10 a.m. on Friday at the St. John Episcopal Church in Napoleon with Pastor Collins Asonye officiating. Interment will follow at the Glenwood Cemetery in Napoleon with military honors accorded by the Napoleon Joint Veteran Posts.
