Paul C. Cameron, 88, of Archbold, Passed away on February 12, 2020 at the Defiance Inpatient Hospice Facility.

Paul was born on August 5, 1931 to the late Richard and Ruth (Buehrer) Cameron in Williams County. He married Mary June Cameron who passed away in 2010.

Paul was a Sharpshooter for the United States Marine Corp. for 13 years. After serving his county, he got his pilot's license and purchased the Montpelier Airport where he flew airplanes for many years. Paul also helped Federal agencies catch people scamming the elderly through the internet with Seniors Against Crime. Several arrests were made thanks to his dedication and willingness to help.

Paul is survived by a stepdaughter, Kathy Bradell, five nieces and a nephew. He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, June; his sister, Gertrude Fedderke; and his brother Richard Cameron.

“ I remember Paul from my childhood. Paul's parents ran a grocery store in our little village of Ridgeville Corners, Ohio.

One of the citizens of Ridgeville named "Shorty" Dean Darst, purchased a WW II trainer airplane called a PT - 19 after the war. It was an open air (cockpit) pilot - trainer airplane.

Shorty used to give us little boys an occasional free ride in his plane as a reward for helping him.

Paul was five years older than I at the time which would have put him in his late teen age years. Paul was the only boy I knew who wanted to do "Stunts" with Shorty in that open air airplane. They would do loops and rolls all without a parachute.

I considered Paul a real daredevil.

What an impressive and responsible person he turned out to be!

And what an impressive career he had as a Sharpshooter in the "Corps!"

He was a member of the RHS School Class of 1949; however he did not graduate.
