



## Paul F. Schwiebert

Paul F. Schwiebert, 95, of Hamler, Ohio died on Tuesday, January 2, 2018 at Genacross Lutheran Services – Napoleon Campus. He was born May 1, 1922 in Hamler, Ohio to the late Ferdinand and Mary (Wiebeck) Schwiebert. On November 19, 1949 he was married to Doris L. (Dietlein) Schwiebert in Zion Lutheran Church, Bay City, Michigan who preceded him in death on May 6, 2014.

Paul was a lifelong farmer and lifelong member of Hope Lutheran Church, Hamler, where he held several offices. He attained the rank of Sargent and was the recipient of the Purple Heart Medal and Bronze Star Medal
