R. Frank Cuff, 77, of Fayette, Ohio passed away peacefully at his home surrounded by his family on Thursday, August 3, 2023. He was born in Morenci, Michigan on June 6, 1946, to Darling “Marvel” Russell. On October 24, 1997, he married Betsy Hartman in Las Vegas, Nevada.

Frank proudly served his country in the US Army  $\frac{3}{4}$  Calvary 25th Infantry Division, C Troop, during the Vietnam War.
