Robert L. Brubaker, 81, of Napoleon, Ohio died peacefully on Saturday, November 4, 2023 at CHP Defiance Area Inpatient Hospice Center.

He was born January 19, 1942 in Napoleon, Ohio to the late Lester “Earl” and Naomi (Ellerton) Brubaker. On February 26, 1988 he married Phyllis Myers. Bob was a 1959 graduate of Napoleon High School and attended Bowling Green State University to study photography. He furthered his studies in Wastewater treatment and worked as the Chief Operating Officer for the City of Napoleon Wastewater Treatment Plant for many years. After he retired, he worked as the maintenance superintendent for Oakwood Village Apartments in Napoleon.

Bob was a member of First Presbyterian Church, Napoleon, where he was the Sunday school teacher. He was an avid photographer, golfer, bowler, and fisherman. He was the troop leader for the Napoleon Boy Scouts. He volunteered for the American Cancer Society and Henry County Relay for Life.

He is survived by his wife, Phyllis; daughters, Lori (James) Popil and Leigh Ann (Kevin) Towne; stepson, Chad (Cassandra) Meyers; 4 grandchildren; 5 step grandchildren; and a sister-in-law, Sharon Brubaker. He was also preceded in death by brothers, Roger and Terry Brubaker.

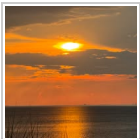
