Robert Arthur Rohrs, 77, of Malinta, Ohio died unexpectedly on Saturday, February 24th, 2024 at his residence. He was born December 4, 1946 to the late Arthur and Hilda (Meyer) Rohrs. On July 1, 1967, he married Jeraldine Mason at Hope Lutheran Church, Hamler, Ohio.

Bob was a 1964 graduate of Hamler High school and enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corp and served from 1965-1971.
