Paul H. Shartzter, 83, of Napoleon, died peacefully at the Napoleon Lutheran Home on Thursday, August 15, 2013. He was born March 9, 1930 in Napoleon to the late William Shartzter and Ruth (Mengerink) Shartzter. On August 5, 1951, he married Jennie Cortright at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Napoleon. 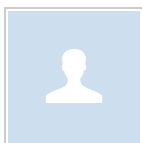

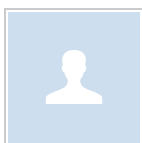

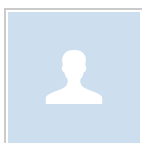
