Leo D. Snyder, Jr., 86, of Napoleon, Ohio died Monday morning , June 8 ,2009 at his residence.He was born in Napoleon on February 9, 1923 to the late Leo Delbert Snyder, Sr. and Mildred Krotzer Snyder. Leo and Betty Mae (Schuldt) were married April 16, 1944 in Napoleon and shared 65 years together. Leo co-owned and operated Snyder Chevrolet in Napoleon from 1945 until his retirement in 1983, with his brother, Charles. In 1969, he co-founded the Napoleon Wash-n-Fill and continued a proud dedication to his companies. He was a member of St. Paul United Methodist Church in Napoleon, member of the Napoleon Public Library Board for 42 years, serving as president from 1980 to 1985, former president and member of the Napoleon Chamber of Commerce and Charter member of the Napoleon Rotary Club , 32nd degree Mason and member of the Shriners International and Scottish Rite Freemasonry. He was a member of the Napoleon Elks Lodge #929, and Hiawatha Sportsmen's Club in Engadine, Michigan.Leo was a wonderful husband and father and is survived by his wife, Betty, and three sons, Michael (Kathy) Snyder of Petoskey, Michigan; Thomas (Susie) Snyder and William (Terri) Snyder both of Napoleon; 5 Grandchildren and 7 Great Grandchildren; a brother, Robert Kenneth (Jennie) Snyder of Engadine, Michigan; and a sister, Mary Beth (Bill) Stoltz of Bellefontaine, Ohio. He was preceded in death by a brother Charles (Marjy) Snyder of Napoleon. Funeral services will be held on Thursday, June 11, 2009 at 10:30 AM at St. Paul United Methodist Church in Napoleon. Interment will follow at the Forest Hill

Cemetery in Napoleon. Visitation will be held on Wednesday from 2-4 and 6-8 PM at the Rodenberger Funeral Home in Napoleon and one hour prior to the service at the church on Thursday.
