Steven Craig Warnimont, age 70, of Napoleon, Ohio passed away peacefully with his loving family by his side on February 7, 2024, at Flower Hospital in Sylvania, Ohio. He was born on July 13, 1953, in Napoleon, Ohio, to the late Donald and Marilyn (Miller) Warnimont.

Steve gracefully demonstrated a tremendous amount of perseverance, mental strength, and patience. He was truly an inspiration to all of those around him as his positivity was a treasured trait. Additionally, Steve was a man of many honorable qualities including being dedicated to his family as a loving husband and supportive father. Steve was a very giving man and always had a warm smile and a listening ear to share. He was honest, trusting,

dependable, respectful, and humorous.

Steve loved his second home at Clear Lake, Indiana. He especially enjoyed gathering with his family and neighbors there. He appreciated the beautiful sunsets, boating, water sports, and long walks. He was dedicated to healthy living as he was an avid walker and swimmer. In addition, Steve spent his time with his family traveling, enjoying country music and attending concerts, watching hockey, attending baseball and football games, and going to Broadway shows at The Stranahan Theater. He also enjoyed visiting the casino to play the slot machines and playing the lottery weekly. He enjoyed a good steak dinner, deviled eggs, and never met a dessert he didn't enjoy. He also dearly loved his dogs and spoiled them as members of the family.

Steve is survived by his wife, Beverly; sons, Chad (Perrysburg) and Kyle (Napoleon); sisters, Cheryl Medina, and Teri (Doug) Ordway of Holgate; brother, Brad (Sue) Warnimont of Rio Grande; sister-in-law, Jackie (David) Hoellrich of Sylvania and brother-in-law, Larry Rahmel of Defiance. 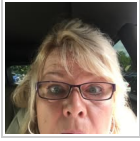
