Margaret Ann Vajen, 85, of Napoleon, OH died Wednesday evening, October 27, 2010 at the Golden Living Center - Northcrest in Napoleon. She was born March 27, 1925 in Napoleon to the late Franklin "Lee" & Esther (Hornung) Franz. In 1945, she married Robert Vajen at the St. John UCC Church, Holgate. Margaret was a homemaker, who raised 7 children, Susan (George) Huber of Overland Park KS, Dr. Thomas (Mary Jane) Vajen of Lancaster, OH, Margo (Joe) Pichotta of Barrington, IL, Gwen Rohrbaugh of Napoleon, Jan (Susan) Vajen of Sylvania, Kevin (Tammy) Vajen of Napoleon, and Denise (David Chrislip) Vajen of Cincinnati, OH. She also helped her husband run their family business, "The Idle Hour" in Napoleon from the late 50s thru the 60s, managed the family farm for over 25 years, worked for Home Oil and United Telephone in Napoleon, and the Ohio Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation in Defiance for over 16 years. Margaret was a life member of the St. John UCC Church and its organist for over 25 years. She was also a former Florida American Legion Auxiliary member and a Holgate Eastern Star member. Those who knew Margaret Ann know she most enjoyed her role as Grandma Vajen to her 24 grandchildren and 24 great-grandchildren, to whom she will always be the legendary game player, head pizza chef and spirited joke-teller. Besides her parents she was preceded in death by her husband, Robert in 1975; an infant daughter; and a brother, Franklin "Bud" Franz. Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. on Saturday, November 6, 2010 at St. John UCC Church, Holgate with Pastor Jane Hillman officiating. Interment will
